



THE SKIPPER

Commander Richard Lull COCHRANE, USN, 37, Commanding Officer, U.S.S. JOHN R. CRAIG (DD885), is the son of Vice Admiral and Mrs. E. L. COCHRANE of 2 Larchwood Drive, Cambridge, Mass., and was graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1940.

During the early years of World War II, Cdr. COCHRANE served aboard the U.S.S. HELENA (CL50) until she was sunk in 1943, and later aboard the U.S.S. WASP (CL18). From 1944-1947, he attended post-graduate school at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he received a Masters Degree in Mechanical Engineering. Duty then took CDR. COCHRANE aboard the U.S.S. ATLANTA (CL104), and, in 1949, the U.S.S. BASILONE (DDE824). From 1950 to January 1954, he was attached to the Surface Antisubmarine Development Detachment at Key West, Florida. Since January 1954 when he relieved Commander James M. ROBERTSON, CDR. COCHRANE has been Commanding Officer, U.S.S. JOHN R. CRAIG (DD885).

Commander COCHRANE is married to the former Ellen Douglas McCallie of Chattanooga, Tenn. With their three children, Charlotte Lull, 9, Ellen Douglas, 7, and Richard Lull, 2, they reside at 804 Tarento Drive, San Diego, Calif.

Commander COCHRANE wears the Secretary of the Navy Unit Commendation with one star, the American Defense ribbon, World War II Pacific Theater ribbon with seven stars, the Atlantic Theater ribbon, the World War II victory medal, and the Japanese Occupation and China Service ribbon.

THE EXEC

Lieutenant Hayes Ashton DORR, 32, was born in Philadelphia, Pa., graduated from the Haverford School, Haverford, Pa., in 1940 and the U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis in 1943.

Lt. DORR saw duty during World War II on the USS IDAHO (BB42) as a watch and gunnery division officer. He spotted main battery fire for bombardments before the invasions of MAKIN, KWAJALEIN, SAIPAN, GUAM, PELELIU, IWO JIMA, and OKINAWA. After the war he served on the staff of COMCRUDIV 10, in the light cruisers USS PROVIDENCE and USS PORTSMOUTH of the Atlantic Fleet. In 1947 he was assigned to staff duty as Aide and Flag Lt. with COMSERVLANT in Norfolk, Va., and in 1949 in San Diego on the staff of the Commandant 11th Naval District.

Lt. DORR graduated from the U. S. Naval Intelligence School in 1950 and served for two years as Asst. Naval Attache to the American Embassy, New Delhi, India. He returned to the Pacific Fleet in 1952 as Operations Officer in USS McDERMUT (DD677). He was ordered in April of 1953 to the USS JOHN R. CRAIG as Operations Officer and as Executive Officer in August of 1954.

Married to the former Nancy Dell Gladden of Coronado, Calif., he has two children—Robert Dalton, 3, and Catherine Clifton 1½. He and his family reside at 941 "G" Avenue in Coronado.

Lt. DORR wears the American Defense, WW II, Pacific Theater with 6 stars, Atlantic Theater, WW II Victory, Japanese Occupation, China Service, Philippine Liberation, Korean Defense and the UN Service Ribbons.
