COMMANDER ANDREW K. SHREVE, U.S. NAVY

Commander SHREVE arrived on board USS MEREDITH (DD-890) in January 1963.

CDR Andrew K. SHREVE was born in Washington, D.C. and resided there until he entered the Navy's flight training program in 1942. He was commissioned Ensign and designated a Naval Aviator in January 1945.

After receiving his commission, CDR SHREVE's first operational assignments were in Patrol Bombing Squadrons on the West Coast and in Alaska. From September 1946 until June 1948 he attended the University of Pennsylvania. From 1948 until 1951 he flew with Patrol Squadron 23, which at that time was the Navy's Hurricane Reconnaissance Squadron, based at Miami, Florida. In 1951 he attended the Navy's General Line School in Monterey, California and while there transferred from aviation to general line status. Since 1952, he has served as Gunnery Officer in USS GOODRICH (DDR-831), as Executive Officer in USS NAWMAN (DE-416), as Operations Officer and as Navigator in USS POCONO (AGC-16), and as Commanding Officer of USS SNOWDEN (DE-246). He also has completed tours of duty with the Fleet Training Group in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and on the Staff of Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet.

CDR SHREVE is married to the former Miss Winifred Hill of Shuqualak, Mississippi. CDR and Mrs. SHREVE have four children: Winifred (18), Michael (13), Robert (10), and Elizabeth (8).
