

FOR DUTY WITH THE UNITED STATES PACIFIC FLEET



Commander Carl J. Boyd received his commission as Ensign, U.S. Naval Reserve on 9 June 1945 after completing Midshipman School at the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana.

Following graduation, he served in destroyer assignments until 1950, both in the Pacific and Atlantic Fleets. Next he attended the U.S. Naval Post-Graduate School, Monterey, California, and graduated in June 1953 with a Master of Science Degree in Electronic Engineering. In 1953 he placed the USS HORNET in commission as Electrical Officer; and in 1955 he placed the USS BOSTON (CAG-1), in commission as Fire Control Officer.

In 1956 he was ordered to duty in the Office, Chief of Naval Operations, Surface Warfare Division, followed by a tour as Executive Officer, USS HANSON (DDR-875).

In 1960 Commander Boyd was again ordered to new construction as Executive Officer, USS COONTZ (DLG-9). Following his tour on COONTZ he attended the U.S. Naval War College. He was on duty in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Development Program Division, prior to being ordered to USS WADDELL.
